CLIL: Teaching Subjects Through English

Practical strategies for confident content delivery in English-medium classrooms

Course Overview

This five-day Professional Development Programme is designed for educators who wish to develop the knowledge, skills, and confidence to teach subject content effectively through English.

Drawing on established CLIL methodology and contemporary educational research, participants explore practical strategies for integrating content, mediation, cognition and culture into their teaching while designing engaging, learner-centred lessons for multilingual classrooms.

Using Artificial Intelligence to enhance planning, teaching and assessment

Course Overview

This five-day Professional Development Programme explores the effective and responsible use of Artificial Intelligence in education. Combining theory and practical applications, it helps teachers improve lesson planning, teaching, assessment and productivity while evaluating AI's opportunities and limitations. Participants develop skills to select AI tools, design AI-enhanced activities and integrate digital technologies that support engagement, creativity and critical thinking.

Rather than introducing AI as a collection of digital tools, this programme positions Artificial Intelligence within established principles of effective teaching and learning. Participants critically evaluate AI through recognised pedagogical frameworks, explore ethical and responsible classroom use, and design practical resources that can be implemented immediately in their own educational settings. The emphasis throughout is on enhancing teacher expertise and learner outcomes, ensuring that technology supports educational decision-making.

Inclusive & Intercultural Teaching

Creating accessible, engaging and diverse learning environments

Course Overview

This five-day professional development programme explores how language, culture and pedagogy shape inclusive learning environments. Based on current research in intercultural communicative competence, inclusive education and English language teaching, it helps educators turn cultural and individual diversity into a learning resource. Through interactive workshops, classroom observation, collaborative lesson design and reflective practice, participants gain practical strategies to promote participation, intercultural understanding and inclusive, learner-centred teaching, integrating intercultural awareness and multilingualism into everyday practice.



Day 1

AI and the Future of Education

- What do we mean by culture? Moving beyond stereotypes
- Language, identity, and belonging
- Intercultural Communicative Competence (ICC)
- Reflecting on our own cultural lenses

Activity: Participants analyse authentic intercultural scenarios from educational settings and reflect on how culture influences classroom interaction, expectations and communication.

Inclusive Pedagogy for Diverse Learners

- Universal Design for Learning (UDL)
- Differentiation and scaffolding
- Inclusive classroom interaction

Classroom Observation: Using relevant criteria, participants observe an English lesson at ISE, followed by a discussion on teacher language, participation, interaction and learner engagement, linking practice to current research.

Participants engage critically with contemporary educational theory before applying it through authentic classroom observation, collaborative lesson design, and reflective practice.

The programme offers a unique opportunity to observe experienced language teachers working in genuinely multilingual classrooms — allowing participants not only to explore current research, but also to see how inclusive and intercultural pedagogy is enacted in real educational settings, bridging the gap between theory and professional practice.
